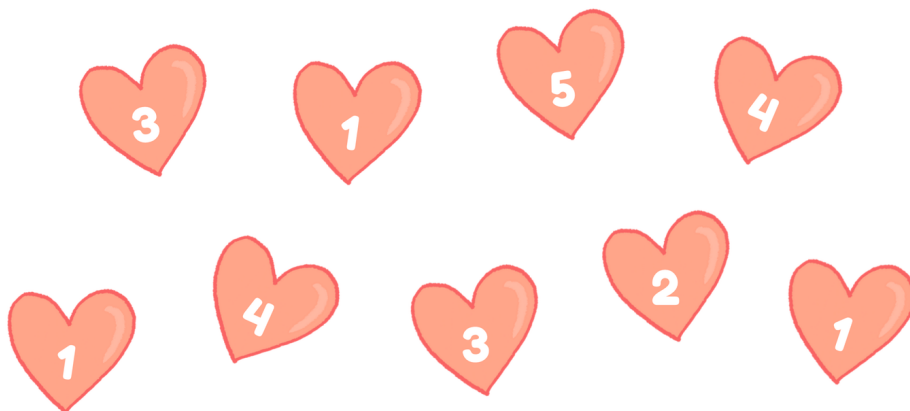
PRIMER 1 | UNIT 1

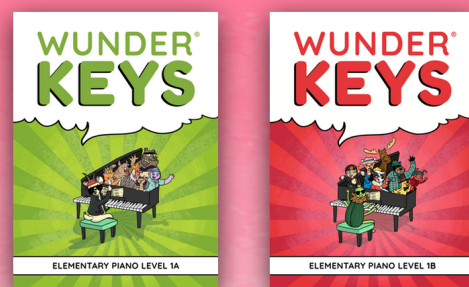
