Treble C Note Reading

SPEED READING

- 1 Place your marker on the first square. Start a timer.
- 2 Roll a die and move your marker along the squares. Name the note where your marker comes to a rest.
- 3 Repeat Step 2 until your game marker reaches the final square. Stop the timer and record your time. Can you beat this time when you play again?
