














#### **LET'S LEARN ABOUT TIED NOTES**




#### AN INTRODUCTION


Technical exercises, sight reading practice, rhythm work, and improvisation accompany the piano repertoire and help develop a solid understanding of eighth notes.





















# UNIT THREE AN INTRODUCTION
