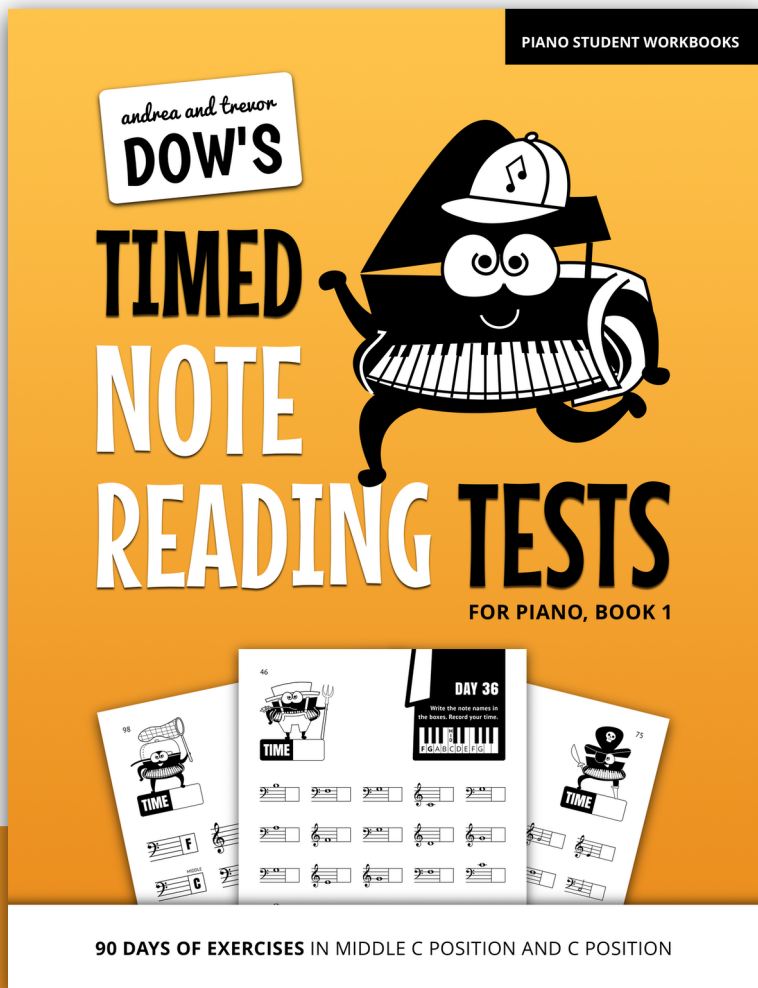

TIMED NOTE READING TESTS

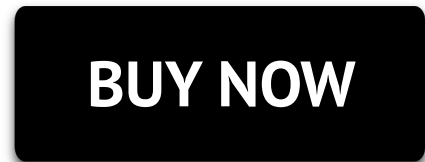
There are 10,080 minutes in a week. You teach each of your piano students for only 30 of these minutes.
