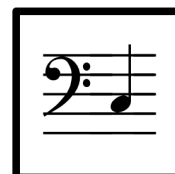

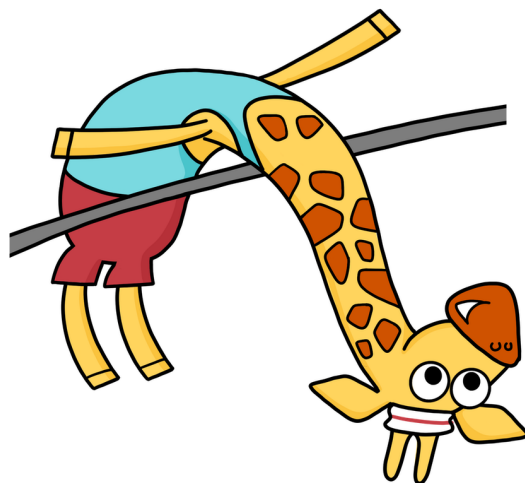
GOLD MEDAL MAZE
